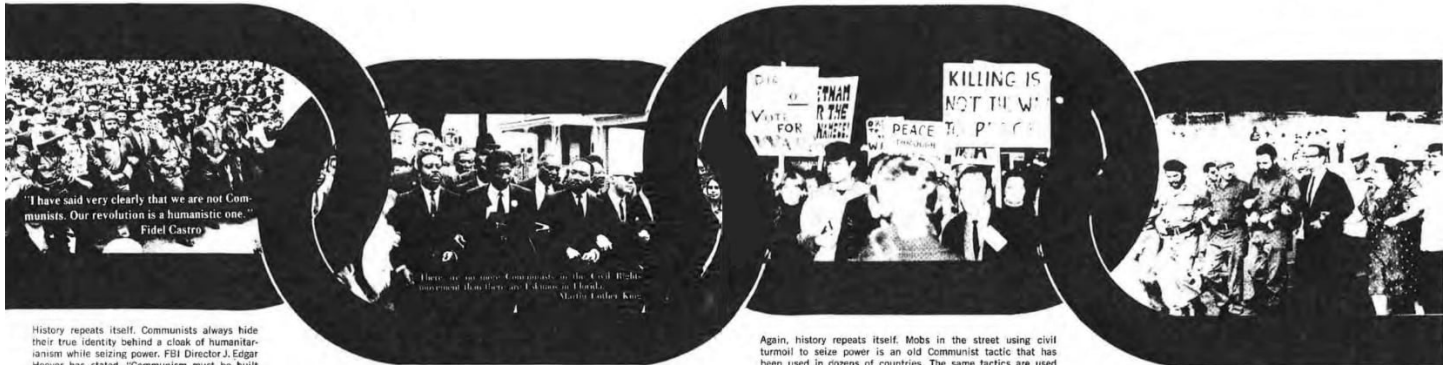




CIVIL TURMOIL FROM HAVANA TO WATTS...



History repeats itself. Communists always hide their true identity behind a cloak of humanitarianism while seizing power. FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover has stated, "Communism must be built with non-Communist hands." Castro vehemently denied any Communist influence in his revolution so he could use non-Communist students, clergy and workers to unknowingly build the sugar cane curtain. "It can't happen here," yawned the Cuban people as Castro filled the streets with any army of gullible idealists, thrill seekers and opportunists, manipulated from behind the scenes by a handful of well trained, hard-core Communists.
