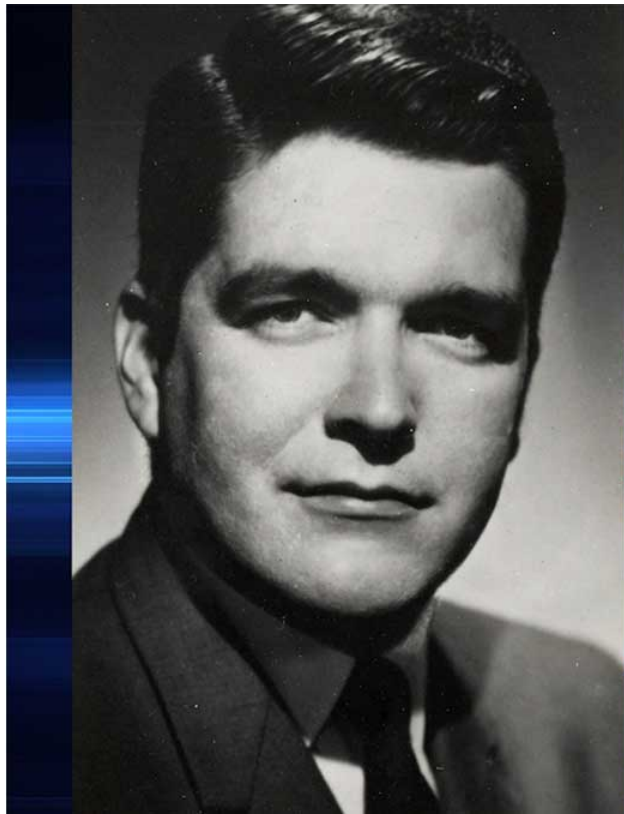




REMEMBERING Larry McDonald
